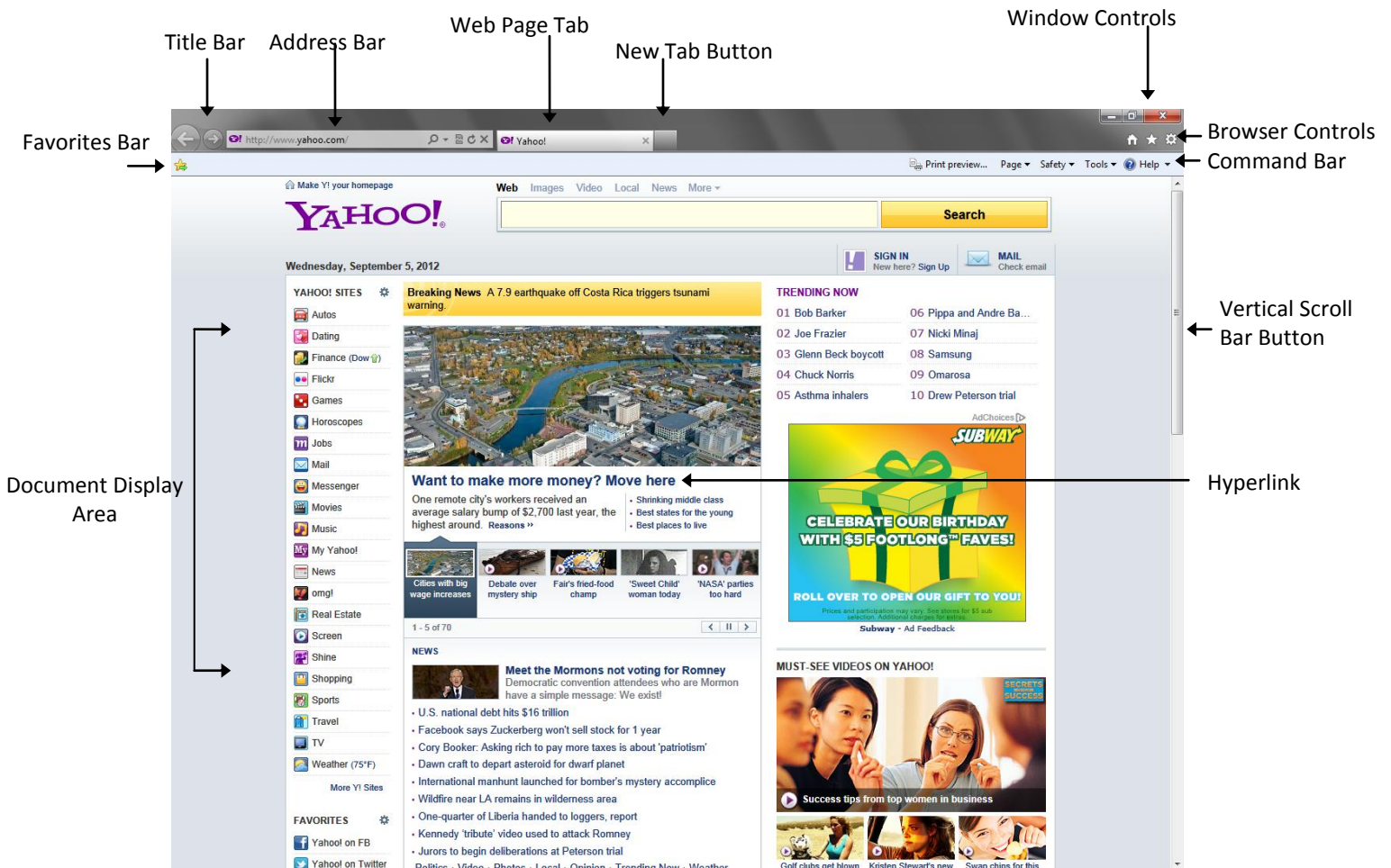



Introducing the Internet Explorer 9 Web Browser



- Previous versions of Internet Explorer displayed the program name and the name of the active webpage in the **title bar** portion of the program window. This was discontinued in IE9. The title of the webpage is displayed in the **web page tab** to the right of the **address bar**.
- The **Address bar** allows you to go directly to a website by typing a URL or will provide search results if you type in a search term or incomplete web address. It shows the address of the current webpage.
- The **favorites bar** is optional. It provides quick access to your favorites.
- The **Browser Controls** 
 - The home button will return you to the browser's home page.
 - The Star will give you access to the Favorites Center.
 - The Gear (tools) provides access to most command bar functions like the print, file, and safety menus.
- The **web page tab** displays the name of the web page.
- The **new tab button** allows you to open a new web page within the browser window.
- The **command bar** does not appear by default. It contains tools to customize the look and settings of the browser.
- The **scroll bar** allows you to move through the document. The **scroll bar button** within the scroll bar is proportional to the length of the current document and can be dragged up and down the scroll bar to move quickly to a new spot in the document.
- A **hyperlink** is a word or image on a web page that, when clicked, will take you to a different page.
- The **document display area** takes up the largest part of the screen. This is where you find the content of the Web page. Links within a Web page are usually distinguished by being a different color than surrounding text and are sometimes underlined.
