General Responsibilities and Examples of Work

- 3. Emptying book drop box and placing materials in the bin.
- 4. Inspecting materials for missing spine labels.
- 5. Moving full carts and bins to Children's Department.
- 6. Collecting mail from different departments.
- 7. Straighten library shelves daily or as needed.
- 8. Perform related work as required.

Qualifications for Employment

Entry level – must be legally eligible to work

Must have a strong knowledge of Dewey decimal system

Ability to sort material in alphabetic and numeric order

Ability to understand and carry out simple oral and written directions
