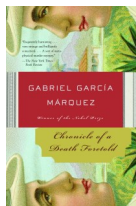

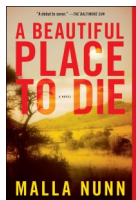
#### CFL Book Club, Wed., Apr. 21, 7PM

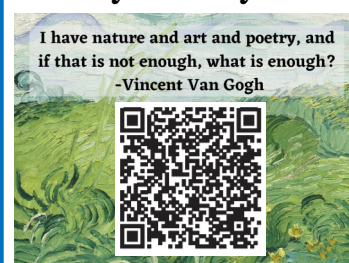


#### Poetry Discussion Group! Thurs., Apr. 1, at 7PM

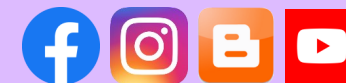
