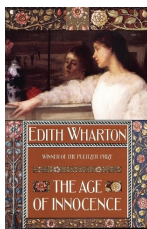

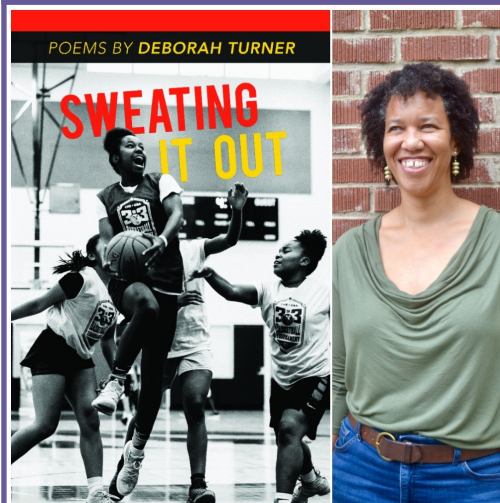


Mobile Hot Spots Now Circulating
